- **School administrators and system leaders** who wish to support implementation of transformative pedagogies supporting engaged citizenship.

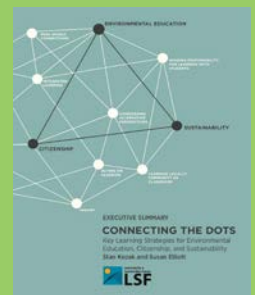
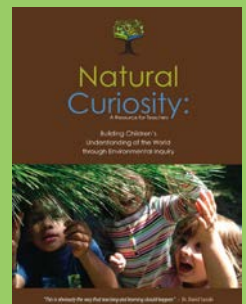
Outcomes—through their participation, educators will:
